

DATA PRIVACY POLICY

Austrian Ski Federation (*Österreichischer Skiverband*)
Ski Austria

PREAMBLE:

For the organization of our association it is essential that personal data is processed.

In this data privacy policy, the Austrian Ski Association (hereinafter also referred to as "**Ski Austria**", "**ÖSV**", "**we**", "**us**" or similar) discloses its data privacy policy (hereinafter the "**Privacy Policy**") in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the Austrian Data Protection Act, so that you are aware of how we process personal data in our association (Ski Austria Group). Personal data is defined as any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person.

Within the framework of this Privacy Policy, we therefore state in particular from which groups of people we process what category of personal data, for what purpose we do this, how long we store the personal data and why the processing of the personal data is in accordance with applicable laws. In this Privacy Policy you will further find information regarding cookies on our website.

1. Affected Groups of persons, purpose and legal basis

Generally, we gather personal data from the following groups of persons:

Persons issuing inquiries using the contact form on our website

If you send us an inquiry via our contact form on our website, the following personal data will be processed from you:

- Salutation
- Name
- E-mail address
- Address (such as name of street, postal code, city)

We process such data in order to facilitate the process for interested persons to contact us.

The data above will be stored by us until the legal basis ceases to exist.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Recipients of the newsletter and of (other) marketing content

If you have subscribed to our newsletter or otherwise consented to the use of personal data for (direct) marketing purposes, the following personal data will be processed (if provided to us accordingly):

- Salutation

- E-mail address
- Name

The processing serves the purpose of informing interested persons and business partners.

The personal data mentioned above will be stored by us until you unsubscribe from the newsletter or until revoke your existing consent. You might revoke your consent at any time and free of charge by sending a mail to datenschutz@skiaustria.at.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is – if provided by law – the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Holders/owners of a Ski Austria card and applicants

If you are a "Ski Austria cardholder" or wish to become part of the "#skiverrückt" Ski Austria's family (and therefore provide us with a corresponding membership application via our website (www.ski-austria.at/de/mitglieder/mitglied-werden)), we process the following personal data from you if provided to us accordingly:

- Basic data: Academic title, name, gender, member club, address, date of birth, member number, nationality, contact details (e.g. telephone, mobile, fax, e-mail address);
- Billing and payment data: Bank data, payment receipts, invoices, means of payment, direct debit authorizations, bank transactions, settlements, credit cards;
- Other data (correspondence, documents)

Further recipients of this personal data might be, depending on the occasion: Responsible regional ski association (*Landesskiverbände*), insurance broker, insurance, ticketing partner (when claiming member benefits), naming platform (in order to be registered for competitions), international professional associations, shipping partner for member magazine, and further taking into account that also an interface with our member database is in place.

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of handling the membership relationship regarding the own service offer (such as regarding member benefits, competitions, information about offered products), to have text documents automatically created and archived (such as correspondence), as well as in order to handle current orders or to provide support in that regard. For new members, the purpose is also the initiation of a membership.

The above-mentioned data will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist. In the event of an error during transmission to our interface with the member database (e.g. error in the member database or non-accessibility of the member database), a log file is created that contains all content entered in the form (e.g. name, contact data). These logs are stored for seven days.

In addition, we would like to expressly point out that you can object to the processing of the provided personal data for (direct) marketing purposes at any time and free of charge by sending a mail to datenschutz@skiaustria.at.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Persons subscribing to the "Ski Austria Magazine" via our website

If you wish to subscribe to the "Ski Austria Magazine" via our website (even as a non-Ski Austria member), we will process the following personal data if provided to us accordingly:

- Basic data: Gender, name, address, date of birth, contact data (e.g. telephone, mobile, e-mail address);
- Billing and payment data: Bank data, payment receipts, invoices, means of payment, direct debit authorizations, bank transactions, settlements, credit cards, customer number;
- Other data (correspondence, documents)

Further recipients of this data might be, depending on the occasion: Austria Ski Team Handels- und BeteiligungsgmbH, shipping partner for member magazine.

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of fulfilling the contract regarding the subscription, to have text documents automatically created and archived (such as correspondence), as well as in order to handle current orders or to provide support in that regard.

The personal data mentioned above will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist, no longer, however, than expiry of legally existing retention obligations.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Persons booking a Ski Austria Camp via our website

If you choose to book a Ski Austria Camp via our website, we will process the following personal data (if provided to us accordingly):

- Type of Ski Austria Camp;
- Name, address, date of birth, membership number, contact data (e.g. telephone, mobile, e-mail address);
- Billing and payment data: Bank data, payment receipts, invoices, means of payment, credit cards;
- Other data (correspondence, documents)

Further recipients of this data may be, depending on the occasion: Austria Ski Sportanlagen Betriebsges.m.b.H (responsible for the operation of the Ski Austria Academy in St. Christoph).

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of a contract initiation and fulfillment of a Ski Austria Camp to be attended, including to have text documents automatically created and archived (such as correspondence), as well as in order to provide support and process current orders.

The personal data mentioned above will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist, no longer, however, than expiry of legally existing retention obligations.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Applicants

We process the following personal data from our applicants:

- Basic data: Name, gender, address, date of birth, contact details (e.g. telephone, mobile, fax, e-mail address);
- Nationality;
- Social security number;
- Intended position;
- Information about education
- Time abroad
- Work experience
- Photo
- Knowledge, skills

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of using and keeping evidence of applications for internal or external recruitment of employees.

We will store the above data for 6 months.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Employees and volunteers at events

We process the following data from employees and volunteers at events, if provided to us accordingly:

- Basic data: Name, address, e-mail, date of birth, telephone/mobile
- Payment data (e.g. bank data)
- Photo
- Citizenship
- Social security number
- Driving license type (A,B, ...)
- Contact person for emergencies (name, relation, e-mail, phone)
- Brief description of school education
- manual skills
- sports skills
- language skills
- PC skills
- Field of activities in which the employee/volunteer might be deployed

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of engaging employees and volunteers for events and to be able to deploy them in the right position at the event.

The personal data mentioned above will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Volunteers at major events

We process the following data (if provided accordingly) from volunteers who support us at our major events (e.g. FIS Alpine Ski World Championships 2025 in Saalbach or Worldcup finals) and who register via the "Event Volunteer Platform" <https://ski-austria.eventvolunteers.de/de/Events>:

- Basic data: Name, address, e-mail, date of birth, telephone/mobile

- Gender
- Citizenship
- Social security number
- ID data
- Profile picture
- Field of application/place of employment
- Availability
- Experience (work experience, volunteer experience, skiing ability)
- Language skills
- Additional qualifications (IT skills, education, internships, driver's license information)
- Clothing sizes
- Contact person for emergencies (name, relationship, e-mail, phone)

We process such personal data in order to serve the purpose of engaging volunteers, especially for major events, and to be able to deploy them in the right position at the event. Furthermore, the data is used for the handling of organizational matters (e.g. clothing issue, booking of accommodation, etc.).

Further recipients of the personal data mentioned above may be, depending on the occasion, the relevant Ski Austria event company (in particular Austria Ski Nordic Veranstaltungsgesellschaft m.b.H., AUSTRIA SKI VERANSTALTUNGSGESELLSCHAFT m.b.H. and Austria SKI WM und Großveranstaltungsges.m.b.H.) or the processor for the operation of the volunteer platform (Eventvolunteers.de UG (haftungsbeschränkt), Theodor-Heuss-Straße 1, 67663 Kaiserslautern).

The above-mentioned data will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist. If the volunteer – e.g. in the course of the registration process – consented that the above-mentioned data may also be used for further purposes (e.g. contacting the volunteer for possible engagements at future (major) events), the data provided will be stored as long as the volunteer has not revoked an existing consent. A revocation can be made at any time and free of charge by sending a message to datenschutz@skiaustria.at.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Business partners, suppliers

We process the following data from our business partners or suppliers:

- Contact person on behalf of the business partner or supplier: Name, telephone number, e-mail address;
- Billing and payment data (e.g. payment receipts, invoices, means of payment, collection authorizations, bank transactions, settlements, credit cards, bank details / credit cards, credit card reference data, etc.);
- Contract data (e.g. terms of delivery or service, special agreements, discounts, commission data);
- Correspondence language;
- Power of representation

We process the personal data above in order to serve the purpose of fulfilling the obligations arising from the business relationship with our business partners and suppliers.

The above-mentioned data will be stored for at least 7 years (as provided for in § 132 BAO), no longer, however than for 30 years (period of limitation).

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR as well as the fulfillment of a legal obligation pursuant Art. 6 (1) lit. c GDPR.

Competitive athletes (*Leistungssportler*)

We particularly process the following data from competitive athletes (please also refer to the more detailed privacy policy for athletes in a ÖSV squad):

- Basic data: Name, gender, address, date of birth, membership number(s), social security number, contact details (e.g. telephone, mobile, fax, e-mail address).
- Emergency contact data (from third parties)
- Billing and payment data (e.g. payment receipts, bank data, sports equipment suppliers, sponsors, etc.)
- Sports-related training and performance data (e.g. sports medical data)
- Sports-related size data
- Results lists and other types of data necessary for the practice of competitive sports (in addition to the types of data necessary for membership, performance sport-related results and performance data as well as data of special categories, training database etc)
- Data for event organization and handling as well as for the handling of travel activities
- Photos, videos

Further recipients of the personal data mentioned above might be, depending on the occasion: Authorized coaches, Technologiezentrum Ski- und Alpinsport GmbH, AUSTRIA SKI VERANSTALTUNGSGESELL-SCHAFT m.b.H., Austria Ski Nordic Veranstaltungsgesellschaft m.b.H., university institutions and anti-doping institutions etc. in order to process results or performance data, doctors, physiotherapists, insurance brokers, insurance companies, equipment suppliers, sponsors, tour operators and/or hotels, consulates, competition organizers, international professional associations (such as FIS, IBU, ISMF), Olympic Committees (ÖOC, IOC, Paralympic Committees).

We process the personal data mentioned above in order to serve the purposes of preparing (the athletes) for sports events (and to execute them), in particular competitions, as well as in order to have an up-to-date results and information service in place.

The personal data stated above will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the fulfillment of a legal obligation pursuant Art. 6 (1) lit. c GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Coaches and other staff (e.g. supervisors)

We process the following personal data from our coaches and other staff:

- Basic data: Name, gender, address, date of birth, membership number(s), social security number, contact details (e.g. telephone, mobile, fax, e-mail address).
- Billing and payment data (e.g. payment receipts, invoices, means of payment, direct debit authorizations, bank transactions, settlements, credit cards, bank details / credit cards, credit card reference data, etc.)
- Contract data (e.g. terms of service, special agreements, discounts, commission data)
- Sports related size data
- Correspondence language
- Photos, videos

We process the personal data mentioned above in order to serve the purpose of fulfilling the obligations arising from the business relationship with our coaches and other staff, as well as for the purpose of providing results and information services.

Further recipients of this personal data may be, depending on the occasion: International professional associations (such as FIS, IBU, ISMF), Olympic Committees (ÖOC, IOC, Paralympic Committees), AUSTRIA SKI VERANSTALTUNGSGESELLSCHAFT m.b.H., Austria Ski Nordic Veranstaltungsgesellschaft m.b.H., doctors, physiotherapists, insurance brokers, insurance companies, equipment suppliers, sponsors, travel organizers and / or hotels, consulates, competition organizers.

The above data will be stored for at least 7 years (as provided for in § 132 BAO), no longer, however than 30 years (statute of limitations).

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the fulfillment of a legal obligation pursuant Art. 6 (1) lit. c GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Media and journalists

We process the following data from media, journalists and our media partners:

- Journalists as well as contact persons on behalf of the media owner or media partner: name, telephone number, e-mail address.
- Media owner
- Press ID

We process the personal data mentioned above to serve the purpose of conduct public relations for the association, its competitive athletes and events.

The above data will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Persons having created a user account via the Ski Austria ticket shop

We process the following data from persons who have created a user account via our ticket shop (www.skiaustriaticket.at) if provided accordingly:

- Name
- E-mail address
- Telephone number
- Address
- Academic title
- Gender
- Date of birth
- If applicable, payment data (IBAN, BIC, card number, card verification number, expiry date, reference number, payment amount)

Ski Austria and its event companies (in particular Austria Ski Nordic Veranstaltungsgesellschaft m.b.H., AUSTRIA SKI VERANSTALTUNGSGESELLSCHAFT m.b.H. and Austria SKI WM und Großveranstaltungsges.m.b.H.) process the personal data in order to serve the purpose of the contractual fulfilment and provision of the tickets ordered. In addition, we use this data to communicate

with the customers regarding their user account and our services and to keep the customers informed about our other upcoming events for which – if required by law – we will obtain a separate consent. Certain personal data (such as the user's e-mail address) is additionally required and processed in order to notify the customers regarding the relevant event(s) (in particular about any possible restrictions regarding the number of visitors and/or prescribed safety measures, particularly for the prevention of COVID-19).

Further recipients of the personal data mentioned above might be, depending upon the occasion: the relevant Ski Austria event company (in particular Austria Ski Nordic Veranstaltungsgesellschaft m.b.H., AUSTRIA SKI VERANSTALTUNGSGESELLSCHAFT m.b.H. and Austria SKI WM und Großveranstaltungsges.m.b.H.), delivery service providers (for postal transmission of tickets), payment service providers or the processor for the operation of the ticket shop (CTS EVENTIM Sports GmbH, HRB 78433, Hohe Bleichen 11, D-20354 Hamburg).




When tickets are paid for via VISA and MasterCard in our ticket shop, payment is processed by CTS EVENTIM Nederland B.V., Postbus 3096, 2130 KB Hoofddorp, Netherlands. Due to legal requirements (implementation of the Payment Services Directive "PSD2") and/or to protect against fraudulent use of credit card data, the so-called 3D Secure procedure may be used. In this regard, browser data, credit card data, address data (billing address, e-mail address), and the transaction amount (incl. currency) are transmitted via the credit card organizations to the card-issuing institution. This data is used by the card-issuing institution to determine the fraud risk of the transaction; depending on the amount and the result of the check by the credit institution, additional approval of the credit card transaction may be required, e.g. via TAN or app.

The above-mentioned data will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist, no longer, however, than expiry of legally existing retention obligations. In addition, we would like to expressly point out that you can object to the processing of the provided personal data for (direct) marketing purposes at any time and free of charge by sending a mail to datenschutz@skiaustria.at.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is the performance/fulfilment of a contract (or precontractual measures) pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. b GDPR, the consent of the affected persons pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. a GDPR and our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Persons submitting a contact request via the Ski Austria ticket shop


Inquiries from persons submitting a contact request via our ticket shop (www.skiaustriaticket.at) are processed directly by our processor for the operation of the ticket shop (CTS EVENTIM Sports GmbH, HRB 78433, Hohe Bleichen 11, D-20354 Hamburg), whereby the following personal data is processed if provided accordingly:

-  Name
-  E-mail address
-  Telephone number

For more detailed information, please see the data protection information of CTS EVENTIM Sports GmbH.

Visitors in the course of events

Apart from personal data processed in the course of purchasing the ticket for an event via the Ski Austria ticket shop, the following data might be processed with regard to visitors:

-  Photos and videos taken in the course of the events (please refer to the General Terms and Conditions for more detailed information in that regard).

We process this data in order to serve the purpose of public relations and a certain news coverage with regard to the respective events. The above-mentioned data will be stored until the legal basis ceases to exist.

The legal basis allowing us to process the personal data stated above is our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based on the purpose mentioned above.

Data processing at events due to the COVID-19 pandemic

We might be required to process personal data of team members and visitors to events due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic (and therefore, if applicable, in connection with legal and/or regulatory requirements) in order to ensure adequate health protection. For example, we may process the following personal data:

- First name and surname
- Address
- E-mail address
- Telephone number

In the event that we carry out such data processing, it is primarily for the purpose of risk prevention, informing you about suspected COVID-19 cases or infections at an event and ensuring rapid communication. In addition, we will inform you of any measures ordered by health authorities. This can also help to contain the spread of the virus.

If we process the above-mentioned data in connection with the containment of the COVID 19 pandemic, we will delete such data as soon as it can be ruled out that we will have to inform you at short notice about suspected COVID 19 cases or infections at an event you attended, unless there is another reason to continue storing the personal data. As a general rule, this is 14 days after the end of the event.

In case we process the personal data mentioned above, we do so in order to perform a task that is in the public interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. e GDPR and based on our legitimate interest pursuant to Art. 6 (1) lit. f GDPR. Our legitimate interest is based, on the one hand, in reducing your health risks when attending an event and, on the other hand, generally in containing the spread of infection in the course of an event.

The above-mentioned data may also be transmitted to the competent health authority. The legal basis for the transmission to the health authority is Art. 6 (1) lit. e and lit. f GDPR in conjunction with Art. 10 (2) Austrian Data Protection Act. Furthermore, at the request of the health authority, there may also be an obligation to provide information pursuant to Art 6 (1) lit. e and lit. f GDPR in conjunction with Art. 5 (3) Epidemics Act 1950.

In addition, it may happen that COVID-19 tests are carried out directly at the event for certain groups of persons and that there might be obligations (e.g. for team members) to show a negative COVID-19 test in order to participate in an event or to be allowed to enter the event premises. The test results are health data, which are special data according to Art 9 GDPR. The processing of such data serves the purpose to contain the spread of COVID-19 and to protect members of teams and visitors of events.

Test results are stored for as long as necessary to contain COVID-19 cases at our events.

The legal basis allowing us to process such data is based on the public interest in the area of public health, in particular the protection against serious cross-border health threats pursuant to Art 9 (2) lit. i) GDPR.

The test results might also be transmitted to the competent health authority. The legal basis for the transmission of test results to the competent health authority is Art 9 (2) lit. i) GDPR in conjunction with Art. 10 (2) Austrian Data Protection Act. Furthermore, at the request of the health authority, there may also be an obligation to provide information on suspected cases and infections pursuant to Art. 9 (2) lit. i) GDPR in conjunction with Art. 5 (3) of the Epidemic Act of 1950.

2. Links to other websites and social media

It might be the case that you will also find links to third-party websites on our website and applications, plug-ins or content from third-party providers (in particular as part of our "Social Wall" at www.skiaustria.at/de/social-wall). In this regard, our website sometimes uses social media widgets from Streamchartz, a service provider operated by the "Bluforce Group" based in Salzburg, Austria. When these widgets are opened, IP addresses and cookie information may be transmitted to Streamchartz in order to provide the functionality of the widgets. Streamchartz's privacy policy can be found here: www.streamchartz.com/s/privacy-policy/.

We have included the plug-ins or such third party links mainly for informational purposes. Please note that these third-party websites are generally not within our sphere of influence and are therefore not covered by this Privacy Policy. If you visit the website of third parties (for example, by clicking on the corresponding link), personal data might be collected or processed by the respective operators. In this regard, please refer to the respective privacy policy of the corresponding website operator.

3. Data security

The Ski Austria Group has taken appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect personal data against, among other, accidental or intentional manipulation, loss, destruction and unauthorized access. The measures taken are subject to regular review and are continuously adapted to the state of the art.

Notwithstanding our efforts to maintain an appropriately high level of diligence at all times, it cannot be ruled out that information disclosed to us via the Internet may be viewed and used by other persons.

Please note that we therefore accept no liability whatsoever for the disclosure of information due to errors in data transmission not caused by us and/or unauthorized access by third parties (e.g. hacker attack on e-mail account or telephone, interception of faxes).

4. Your rights

You have the following legal rights according to GDPR with regard to your personal data.

- **Right of access (Art. 15 GDPR):** Upon request, we shall provide you with information about the personal data processed and the purpose of the processing within one month.
- **Right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR):** In case of incorrect or incomplete data, you may request rectification.
- **Right to erasure ("right to be forgotten") (Art. 17 GDPR):** We must erase personal data if it is not necessary for the purposes of processing, you withdraw your consent (unless there is another, additional authorization for processing) or the personal data has been processed unlawfully.
- **Right to restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR):** You can request a restriction of processing if, for example, your personal data is to be used only for specific purposes.
- **Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR):** You have the right, in the cases prescribed by law, to receive the personal data concerning you in a structured, common and machine-readable format.

- **Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR):** You may object to processing based on public interest or our legitimate interest.

5. Disclosure of personal data to third parties / recipients

Generally, we do not submit/transmit any personal data to third parties. However, due to the association's agendas, legal obligations and the complexity of today's data processing processes, it is sometimes essential to pass on personal data also to third parties (see also Section 1 above). 6. Accessibility, use of AccessWidget


We use the services of AccessiWay GmbH, located in Vienna, Austria, to produce a website that is as digitally accessible as possible. In order to make the website technically accessible, purely technical data is transmitted to the server of AccessiBe Ltd, Israel (GDPR compliant by adequacy decision), with server location USA (GDPR compliant by SCC, Standard Contractual Clause). This data is SSL3 encrypted and deleted immediately after retrieval of the accessible, technical information.

No data storage takes place. Only the IP address, user agent (web browser). Refer Website. No cookies are set or stored, the data transfer is purely technical in nature and serves the technical production of a barrier-free website.

7. Cookies, analytics service and integration of videos

- The collected data will be stored until you request to delete it or until you delete the Cookiebot cookie yourself or until the purpose for storing the data no longer applies. - If you use our "my Ski Austria module" and thus define your favorite sports, you will be presented with news items pre-filtered to your preferences. For this purpose, we save the "digest_interests" cookie locally when you actively select your favorite sports. This cookie only contains IDs of sports and is deleted at the end of the session.
- You can find the cookies used on our website (including current information and revocation options) in the "Cookies" category on our website (www.ski-austria.at/de/datenschutz).

■ **Google Analytics:** Insofar as you have given your consent as part of the cookie consent, this website uses "Google Analytics 4", a web analytics service provided by Google LLC. The responsible entity for users in the EU/EEA and Switzerland is Google Ireland Limited, Google Building Gordon House, 4 Barrow St, Dublin, D04 E5W5, Ireland ("**Google**").

- Google Analytics uses cookies to analyze the use of our website by visitors. The information collected by means of the cookies about your use of this website is generally transferred to a Google server in the USA and stored there.

Use of cookies on our website for the ticket shop:

■ For this purpose, every website visitor is forwarded to Queue-it and, depending on the respective load, either directly forwarded to the website or to a so-called virtual

waiting room. This requires the collection of the IP address of the respective user. The legal basis for such processing is Art. 6 (1) sentence 1 lit. f) GDPR.

- Immediately after the user has been forwarded to the website, the IP address is deleted.

Likewise, technically necessary cookies are used for our website for the ticket shop (www.skiaustriaticket.at):

- The legal basis for the processing of your personal data in the context of the use of technically necessary cookies is Art. 6 (1) lit. f) GDPR. The use of these technically necessary cookies serves to simplify the use of our website. Some functions of our website cannot be offered without the use of cookies. For these, it is necessary that your browser is recognized even after a page change. Your personal data will not be processed in any other way.
- Your personal data will be deleted as soon as such personal data is no longer required to achieve the purpose for which such personal data was collected; this is particularly the case when you leave the website.
- Cookies are stored on your computer in case of permission and transmitted from it to our website. Therefore, you have full control over the use of cookies.
